SATURDAY, OCTOBER 17 –

Depart Nashville with American Airlines flight #4443 to New York (JFK) leaving at 3:23pm, arriving at 7:00pm. Connect with American Airlines flight #18 nonstop to Tel Aviv leaving at 11:30pm.

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 18 – RAANANA (D)

Upon arrival at Ben Gurion Airport at 5:00pm, you will be met by a Ya'lla Tours USA Israel representative and your tour guide who will assist the group with the transfer to your hotel for dinner and overnight. PRIMA MILLENNIUM RAANANA HOTEL is in the high-tech district of Raanana, 9 miles from Tel Aviv. www.prima-hotels-israel.com/prima-millennium-raanana-hotel

MONDAY, OCTOBER 19 – GALILEE (B,D)

We will begin our touring today with a drive through the fast-growing towns and farms of the Plain of Sharon to Caesarea Maritima, a large port city built by Herod the Great to honor Roman Caesar Augustus. Herod built a port in the bay and erected all the cultural institutions found in every great Greco-Roman city, including a theater, a hippodrome, and a luxurious bathhouse. To supply water to the city, he built an aqueduct system stretching from the springs of Mt. Carmel to Caesarea. The Book of Acts refers repeatedly to Caesarea as the city Peter visited (Acts 10). Continue north to Mt. Carmel to visit Muhraka, where Elijah challenged the prophets of Baal. Next, we head to Megiddo (I Kings 9:15), where archaeological digs have revealed 26 layers of civilization, including fortifications of King Solomon and a water tunnel of King Ahab. Megiddo provides a magnificent view of the fertile Jezreel Valley, the prophesied site of Armageddon at the crossroads of the ancient Via Maris "freeway." Continue to our hotel on the shores of the Sea of Galilee for dinner and overnight. EIN GEV HOLIDAY RESORT is a kibbutz hotel located on grassy, palm-shaded grounds on the eastern shore of the Sea of Galilee. www.eingev.com

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 20 – GALILEE (B,L,D)


Take a private boat ride on the Sea of Galilee and then visit the 2,000-year-old Ginosar Boat (the "Jesus boat") discovered in 1986. Visit the New Testament village of Magdala (Matthew 27:56, 61). Continue to Tabgha, the traditional site of the multiplication of bread and fish (John 6:1) and then to Capernaum, with an ancient synagogue where Christ taught. Enjoy a St. Peter's Fish lunch by the shores of the Sea of Galilee. Then visit the Church of the Primacy, where Peter was first among the apostles to confess the divinity of Jesus (Matthew 16:16, Mark 8:29; John 6:69). Then drive to Kursi and see the remains of the Byzantine church and floor mosaic commemorating the miracle of the swine running into the Sea of Galilee (Mark 5:15). Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 21 – GALILEE (B,D)

Visit the Mt. of Beatitudes, the traditional site where Jesus delivered the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5). Next we head north to the ruins of the prehistoric settlement at Tel Dan, once a thriving Canaanite community and the northern limit of the Promised Land. It was here that King Jeroboam set up a pagan altar that brought disaster on Israel. Back on the bus, we continue north to Caesarea Philippi (Banias Spring), where Peter confessed to Jesus, "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God" (Matthew 16:16). Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight.



THE DEAD SEA

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 22 – JERUSALEM (B,L,D)

Visit Cana, best known as the place where Jesus performed "the first of his signs," turning water into wine at a wedding feast (John 2:1-11). Continue to Nazareth (Matthew 2:19-23). Visit Nazareth Village for a first-hand experience of the way of life in Galilee during the days of Jesus. Continue to Mt. Precipice (Luke 4:28-30), where Christ was taken in order to "throw Him down the cliff." Take in the view of the Jezreel Valley (Armageddon), Mt. Tabor (Mt. of Transfiguration) and Mt. Gilboa (where Gideon chose his 300 brave men). Then drive to Shiloh, where the portable Tabernacle that Moses built in the wilderness was stationed from the time of the conquest until the city's apparent destruction by the Philistines in 1104BC. "He abandoned the tabernacle of Shiloh, the tent he had set up among men" (Psalm 78:60). Enjoy lunch at Shiloh. Then climb the Judean hills to the most beautiful city in the world, JERUSALEM. Continue to your hotel for dinner and overnight. GRAND COURT JERUSALEM is located within easy walking distance of Jerusalem's Old City. <https://www.grandhotels-israel.com/grand-court-hotel-jerusalem>

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 23 – JERUSALEM (B,D)

Drive to Bethphage on the eastern slopes of Mt. of Olives to see an authentic, first-century tomb. Then visit the Church of Pater Noster on the hill where Jesus was inspired with the Lord's Prayer. The walls of the church are covered with the prayer written in over 85 languages (Matthew 6:9-13). Drive to the top of Mt. of Olives (Acts 1:8) for a magnificent view of the Old City. Take the "Palm Sunday Walk" to the Dominus Flevit Church ("the Lord weeps" Luke 19:41-44). During construction in 1955, archaeologists uncovered artifacts dating back to the Canaanite period, as well as tombs from the Second Temple and Byzantine eras and remains of a lovely Byzantine shrine with an elaborate mosaic floor that was incorporated into the church. Continue walking down to the Garden of Gethsemane (Matthew 26:36). Some of the oldest olive trees in the world are here. Visit the Church of All Nations, which contains the stone where Jesus prayed on the night of his betrayal, according to tradition. We will have time for singing, reflection, and prayer in a quiet area of the Garden of Gethsemane. Enter the Old City through Stephen's Gate (Lion's Gate) and the Christian Quarter. Here is the Pool of Bethesda (John 5:1), where Jesus healed the lame man, and St. Anne's Church, an outstanding example of Crusader architecture with amazing acoustics. Walk the Via Dolorosa, the Way of the Cross, to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. In 325, Constantine's mother Helen first requisitioned the area for a church. The 4th-century church was largely destroyed by the Turks in 1009 and partially restored in 1048. The impressive stone decorations adorning the facade date from Crusader times. In its current form, the church preserves the Crusader structure and is shared by two major Christian denominations, the Greek Orthodox and the Roman Catholic. The church enshrines a tomb that some traditions hold to be the place of Jesus's burial and resurrection. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

SATURDAY, OCTOBER 24 – JERUSALEM (B,D)

Drive east from Jerusalem to the lowest place on Earth, the Dead Sea. Drive around Jericho to Kasr el Yahud on the Jordan River to renew your vows of Baptism. Then drive along the Dead Sea and view Qumran, where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found in 1947. Continue to Masada, a natural fortress with majestic ruins overlooking the Dead Sea. Take a cable car to the top of Masada for a tour. Jewish Zealots held the rock for several months in 73AD under siege by the 10th Roman legion.

The Romans finally took the fortress by way of a massive attack ramp. The camps and other fortifications that encircle Masada constitute the most complete Roman siege works to have survived until today. Then drive to the Dead Sea for a float in the soothing, therapeutic water. Return to Jerusalem for dinner and overnight.

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 25 – JERUSALEM (B,L,D)

Visit Yad Vashem Holocaust Memorial. “As the Jewish people’s living memorial to the Holocaust, Yad Vashem safeguards the memory of the past and imparts its meaning for future generations. For over half a century, Yad Vashem has been committed to four pillars of remembrance: Commemoration, Documentation, Research, and Education.” Then visit the Israel Museum to see an exhibition of the Dead Sea Scrolls at the Shrine of the Book and a scale model of Jerusalem as it was in Jesus’ time. Drive 6 miles south of Jerusalem to Bethlehem (Micah 5:2 and Luke 2:1). Enjoy a typical Arabic lunch. Then visit the Church of the Nativity, the oldest church in the Holy Land still in use. Construction of this church began in 327AD over the traditional birthplace of Jesus. Continue through the Field of Boaz to Shepherds’ Field (Luke 2), where we will revisit the Christmas story with the angels and shepherds of Bethlehem. Return to Jerusalem for dinner and overnight.

MONDAY, OCTOBER 26 – JERUSALEM (B,D)

Start the morning with a visit to Caiaphas Palace (Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu, John 18:12) and see the cistern where Jesus was held before he was taken to Pilate and the Roman Period steps he walked from the Kidron Valley. Then drive south to visit Tel Azekah, an Israelite military outpost from which we will view the Sorek Valley and the Elah Valley (I Samuel 17:2-19), the site where David slew the giant Goliath with only faith and a slingshot. Visit Tel Lachish, the site of an ancient city, now an archaeological site. The gate at Tel Lachish is the largest in Israel dating to the First Temple period 3,000 years ago. Continue to participate in an archaeological dig in Tel Maresha (Joshua 15:20, 44 and 2 Chronicles 11: 5-8). Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 27 – JERUSALEM (B,D)

Visit the City of David and see excavations which reveal the period of King David. If weather permits, we will walk through Hezekiah’s Tunnel and visit the Pool of Siloam where Jesus sent the blind man to be healed. Walk the Pilgrims Tunnel direct to the Old City. See the ancient Southern Steps and the Hulda Gates (II Kings 22:14) which originally led up to the Temple entrance where Jesus is known to have taught and fought with the money changers. Walk to the Western Wall, the holiest site in Judaism and the only visible remains of the Second Temple, where Jesus walked and taught. Walk through the Western Wall Tunnel, huge arched spaces north of the Western Wall which link to a water tunnel, apparently dug in the Hasmonean period (163 to 37 BC). We conclude our day with a powerful visit to the Garden Tomb, held by many Protestants to be the actual location of the burial and resurrection of Jesus (John 19:38 & Luke 23). We will have time for prayer and Holy Communion. Return to the hotel for time to relax and dinner.

At 8:00pm, transfer to the Ben Gurion Airport for your American Airlines flight #19 nonstop to New York (JFK) departing at 11:20pm.

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 28 –


Arrive JFK at 5:45am. Clear Customs and Immigration and connect with American Airlines nonstop flight #4352 leaving at 7:55am and arriving Nashville at 9:30am.

- Price of the airfare portion of the tour is subject to change until the air ticket has been issued.
- Should a single traveler wish to share a room with another traveler, and Ya'lla Tours is unable to match him/her with a roommate, the single room supplement will apply.
- Should the number of participants, 90 days prior to departure, be lower than the published minimum number of participants to operate the tour, the price will be adjusted accordingly or the tour will be canceled.

DEPOSIT AND PAYMENT POLICY:

- A deposit of \$900 per person is due with registration.
- Final payment is due July 17, 2026.

CANCELLATIONS & REFUND:



WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 28 – PETRA (B,D)

Depart Jerusalem and transfer to the Allenby Bridge. Cross to Jordan and meet your Ya'lla Tours Jordan tour guide. Drive to Mt. Nebo, the traditional burial site of Moses overlooking the Dead Sea and the Jordan Valley. The church is operated by local Franciscan monks and houses magnificent mosaics dating back to the 6th century. Continue to Petra for dinner and overnight. OLD VILLAGE RESORT is a 4-star hotel in the style of a 19th-century village. www.oldvillageresort.com/

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 29 – PETRA (B,D)

Today we will tour the extraordinary, ancient Nabataean capital of Petra hidden in the mountains of southern Jordan. Travel part of the way on horseback and the rest on foot through the narrow canyon or siq. As you approach the end of the Siq, the famous Treasury appears immediately in front of you, an awesome start to an unforgettable experience. Return to the hotel for overnight.

Dinner – At 7:30pm, drive to Petra Kitchen, where you will learn how to cook Jordanian food and then dine on your own creations.

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 30 – AMMAN (B,L,D)

After breakfast, drive to Wadi Rum and take a short 4X4 vehicle ride into the oasis, with its awesome lunar landscape. Enjoy lunch at Wadi Rum. Drive to Amman, Jordan's capital, known as the "White City" because of the white sandstone used in many buildings. Stop briefly for coffee at a café overlooking the Temple of Hercules and the Citadel. Stroll through the old markets in the downtown area and stop to sample some knafeh, a regional treat from the famous Habibah Sweets. Continue to your Amman hotel for dinner and overnight. AMBASSADOR HOTEL is in the heart of the financial district in one of Amman's quietest neighborhoods with a breathtaking panoramic view of the city. <https://ambassadorhoteljo.com/>
